2023 Election Alert

Do you have ideas about the future direction of BCPA? Are there changes you'd like to see? Or, are you happy and want to help BCPA continue? If so, remember that we are volunteer run so please consider running for a board position in this upcoming election.

The election of officers for the BCPA board is set to occur in **February**. We'll share more information in January.

All of the current officers have been in their position for more than the normal time set forth in our bylaws. We're looking for members to step forward to these roles. This way, we get new ideas as well as broader involvement in the direction of the association. To that end, the Board has decided to add two or three positions as Board Members At-Large, like the Conservancy's Board of Trustees. Responsibilities will be to participate in Board meetings and take on tasks as they come up that don't clearly belong to one of the officers. The bylaws are being revised to provide for these positions and to modify the officers' roles to reflect what they have evolved to do. For example, the Registrar board position will be phased out since it has been subsumed by the Treasurer. However, promoting membership is an example of a task for an At-Large Board member. Another task for an At-Large Board member could be Social Committee Director. The Board is very much interested in increasing the Association's off-court social interactions, whether it is a party, a picnic or simply hanging out for food and/or drink.

Playtime Scheduler - What it is and what it isn't

Scheduler allows invited registrants to know who, and how many players expect to attend a particular play session. As

soon as a minimum of four players have added their names to attendees, an additional email goes out to invitees that the session is on. Further, now that access to the courts has become more stringently dependent on key holders, participating registrants will have self-identified





themselves as key holders so that others who want to attend will be able to see that a key holder will be present. The invitations serve as a reminder of an upcoming play session and at which venue.

Scheduler is not a reservation system. To reserve courts requires TennisCall, a separate application only available to Burke Centre residents. Contact the Admin for TennisCall, currently, Jimmy Chu (jimmy@burkecentre.org) to get access. Of course, one needs a court key to play on the courts regardless. BCPA's regular play sessions have been permanently reserved by the Conservancy. If you are part of a group that wants to play at other times and want to reserve the courts for your group, TennisCall is the App for you.

The bottom line is that while use of the Scheduler is not required, it is strongly recommended. The News tab on our website has downloadable instructions on how to register with Scheduler and become added to the invite list, and how to use Scheduler.
